At the charity Prisoners' Education Trust (PET) we believe that everyone in prison, wherever they are and whatever their background, should have access to education.

We offer distance learning courses, advice and guidance and help around 1,500 learners each year to study, giving them the skills and qualifications to build brighter futures.

We offer over 100 courses including GCSEs and A-levels, Open University Access modules and a wide range of professional and general interest courses.

We also use our research and expertise to improve prison education and to show prisons, policymakers and the public the impact education can have – for people in prison, their families and society.

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What is distance learning?

Distance learning with PET is different to traditional classroom-based learning.

You can start most of our courses at any time of the year. All your course materials will be sent to you by post with the support of the education department in your prison.

You study on your own, not in a classroom with other people. This means that you can choose when you study and that you are in control of your progress.

Many of our courses include tutor support by post or phone to help you progress through your course and finish it.

Most PET courses lead to a qualification, and in order to test your understanding you will need to complete assessments along the way. These might include written assignments or exams. You will need to check with prison staff that they can help you send assessments to your course tutor and can organise exams if you need to sit one.

While distance learning can be life-changing, it can also be challenging. To be a successful distance learner you need to be motivated, well organised, self-disciplined, able to work independently and, most of all, passionate about the course you choose.



Why study with PET?

We offer over 100 distance learning courses at a range of levels.

By studying with PET, you can:

- Explore new interests and expand your knowledge
- Achieve recognised qualifications
- Prepare yourself for a new job
- Get feedback from a personal tutor by post or by phone
- Get support from our advice team throughout your studies
- Study in your own time and space – whether in your room, the library or a classroom
- Take your course with you if you are transferred to another prison or return to the community

Our courses can help you make a new start and achieve your goals. But don't just take our word for it. Government research shows that studying with PET increases someone's chances of finding work and reduces the likelihood of them returning to prison.

Our courses can give you so much more besides: studying can boost your mental health, help you gain confidence, and give you something positive to focus on.

While most PET courses are currently paper-based, some are available to study on digital devices – whether on a computer terminal, a laptop or a tablet. This will depend on the digital facilities in your prison and your access to a device. We are working to expand our digital offer all the time. The best way to find out if a course is available to study on a digital device is to contact us.

Who can apply?

PET learners come from all walks of life and different communities, with many having had bad or limited experiences of education previously.

To study some of our courses you will need to have previous experience and qualifications, but we have many courses where you do not need to have any knowledge of the subject. A passion or interest in the topic is important, as is having the motivation to complete your chosen course.

Criteria for applying

There are a few requirements you will need to meet before completing your application for a course. You must:

- Be serving a sentence in a prison in England, Wales, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man (not on remand)
- Have six months or more left to serve on your sentence
- Have gained level 2 English (literacy). Some courses also require level 2 Maths (numeracy) or other qualifications – this is listed in each course description in this prospectus
- Be over 18 years old
- Not be studying another PET course at the same time

If you are applying for an Open University Access module, you must be within eight years of release at the start of the course.

Already studied with PET? Apply for another course!

We are especially keen to see people progress with their studies. If you have just completed a course or have completed one in the past, take a look at what else we have to offer and apply again.

We can offer advice on what to study next, as there will often be a higher level course in the same subject area. If that is not the case or you want to try a different subject, get in touch to discuss your options.

Checking whether a course is suitable for you

Before you apply for a course, your prison will ensure it is appropriate for your needs and circumstances. A member of the education department should review your course options with you and help you complete your application. They will check whether there are any reasons the course might not be suitable for you and support you to choose the best option available.

Choosing a course that's right for you

Now that you know more about distance learning, its benefits and PET's application requirements, it's time to start preparing to study.

Choosing the right course to help you reach your goals is a really important decision. If you are keen to study but not sure which course to choose, here are a few questions to help you to decide and to prepare for your course application.

Interests

Distance learning can be challenging, so choosing a topic that you are interested in will help you keep studying and complete your course. What do you find interesting? Is there a subject you've always wanted to study but never had the opportunity? What subjects or areas do you already know about? Which course could help you build on this knowledge?

Motivation

Think about why you want to study a course. What will motivate you to start and complete it? Are you looking to prepare for a job in prison or on release? Do you want to improve your mental health by doing something positive with your time? It's often helpful to write these goals down to remind yourself why you are studying and what you are looking to achieve.

Strengths

Take some time to think about what you are good at, how you like to learn and what knowledge and experience you already have. How will the course you choose help use and build on your strengths?

Character

Spend some time thinking about you. Are you self-motivated and determined? Are you creative? Do you love numbers and solving problems? What do you enjoy?

Time

Think about how much time you have to study a course. How long do you have left until release? How much time can you set aside in a week for study? This will help you choose a course of the right length. **Find out more on page 12.**

Research

It's so important to find out as much as you can about the course you'd like to study before you apply to PET. Have you got the skills you need to become an independent learner? Will you need any support from prison staff? Will you need to submit assessments or sit an exam? What is the process for applying to PET at your prison?

Choosing the right course level

When choosing a course, think about which level of study is right for you.

For all PET's courses, you will need to have gained level 2 English (literacy), which is available through standard prison education. Some courses also require level 2 Maths (numeracy) or other qualifications – this is listed in each course description in this prospectus.

Having a level 2 qualification in one subject does not necessarily mean you should start at level 3 in another. If you are studying a subject that is new to you, it may be best to start at level 2 if you are not entirely confident.

This table shows how the different qualification levels compare. If your goals involve doing a number of courses, think about how the level of each course fits into your plans.

We encourage you to refer back to this table when looking through our courses so you understand how they fit in to the big picture.



Choosing the right course length

It's important to consider how much time you will need to dedicate to your course before making your application.

Under each course description, we have listed the study hours required. For example, the IOSH Managing Safely course requires 24 hours. This is roughly the number of hours that a typical learner will need to study to complete the course.

This includes time for reading the course materials, writing assignments and communicating with tutors, plus the time required to complete assessments and examinations.

At 24 hours, the IOSH Managing Safely course is one of our shorter options. You should be able to complete it if you study 4 hours a week for 6 weeks. However, some courses require a much bigger time commitment. An Open University Access module, for example, requires 270 hours of study in total. That's 9 hours of study every week for 30 weeks.

When you are thinking about applying for a course, think about how many hours a week you can realistically devote to studying. You can then work out how many weeks the course should take.

PET short courses

If you want to find out what it's like to study a course as a distance learner or you would like to brush up on your study skills, our free short courses are a great place to start.

You don't need to apply and the courses are self-assessed. They can get you ready for distance learning and give you the confidence to study a full accredited course.

There are four courses to choose from:

- Business, Accounting and Bookkeeping
- Construction, Trades, Health and Safety
- Mental Health and Counselling
- Sports and Nutrition

Each course includes modules on:

- Time management
- Reading and note-taking
- Academic writing and clear communication
- Essays and exams
- Making the most of distance learning



Short courses on PET's website

Our digital short courses are a great way to start your journey.

You can explore new topics you may be interested in and brush up on your study skills, helping you prepare for a full distance learning course and get ready for longer qualifications. You don't need to apply and the courses are self-assessed.

You can also print the courses from the website, in case you want to study them when you don't have access to a computer.

We are constantly adding more courses, so check our website to see what's on offer. Current options include:

Short courses on the Virtual Campus

We offer six free digital taster courses on the Virtual Campus – a great way to explore new topics, develop study skills or simply try something different, all at your own pace.

We teamed up with industry experts and people with lived experience of prison to create six courses just for you:

Green Skills

Explore sustainability, the history of energy and pathways into green careers

Health and Fitness

Practical tips, exercises and goal-setting to help you live a healthier lifestyle

Health and Safety

Understand workplace safety, risk assessments and emergency procedures

Music Production and Industry

An introduction to music genres, industry roles and creative skills like lyric writing

Nature Connectedness

Discover the benefits of nature and how to integrate it into your daily life

Social Media and Digital Marketing

Learn how to promote a brand, engage an audience and analyse online data

You don't need to apply for these courses – they are ready and waiting for you wherever you access the Virtual Campus. They're perfect if you're not quite ready for a full distance learning course, you can't apply because you're on remand, or you just want to learn something new.

To access the courses, log in to the Virtual Campus and find them in your "wallet". If you do not have your log in details, speak to your education department.

Support during your studies

Whoever you are and wherever you are, you can get advice and support throughout your studies.

What to expect from your course provider

People who have studied with PET tell us that the quality of course materials and the support they received from their tutor helped them to complete their course successfully.

Here's what you can expect:

Course materials

Your course provider will send you all your study materials – including books, printed materials and CDs, if these are included with your course. You should receive these from your education department no later than four weeks after receiving your letter from PET informing you that your course application was successful.

If after four weeks your course materials have not arrived, ask your education department to check with the provider and to check the prison's post room. If you are unable to speak to your education department, call us for free on the PET Advice Line (you can find our contact details on page 18).

Information about how to complete your course

Some courses require you to send back each module once you complete it, so that your tutor can mark it and provide feedback. Other courses may request all your work at the end. Make sure you find out which applies to you – your course materials should make this clear.

If you are unsure at any stage, give us a call for free on the PET Advice Line or ask your education department to find out from the course provider.

Tutor support

Most of our courses include tutor support. Make sure you take full advantage of it.

Ask your education department to help you contact your tutor at the start of the course – this is really important. Your tutor will give you feedback on your assignments and some offer study support over the phone. Taking on board their advice is a great way to improve your knowledge and your ability to complete the course.

Please note, it can take up to 21 days to receive assignment feedback from your tutor.

If you are having trouble accessing tutor support, call the PET Advice Line or ask your education department to get in touch with us.

Support from your education department

There are many ways you can get support from your education department to help you complete your course – although this can vary depending on what is available at your prison. Support can include:



Catch-ups with education staff

To get advice and support and discuss your study needs, such as contacting your tutor and sitting exams.



Visiting the library or an alternative study space

To help you focus and “switch gears” when it’s time to study.



Peer Support Workers and Red Bands

To offer individual support and lead study sessions, helping you make the most of the benefits of distance learning. Often they will be studying too.

To find out what’s available in your prison, speak to your education department.



Assessments and exams

Most PET courses lead to a qualification and you will usually have to take some kind of assessment to gain it.

There are various ways to assess or test how well you understand your course, usually by completing written assignments or taking an exam.

Find out how your course is assessed

Here's how to find out how your course is assessed and how to get support to arrange your assessment:

1. Each course description in this prospectus shows the exams and assessments you'll need to take. For example, Psychology GCSE on **page 32** is assessed by 2 invigilated, closed book exams (105 minutes each).
2. Before making your application, speak to PET or your education department to find out if your prison can hold your assessment or exams. Not every prison is able to.
3. You can call our free Advice Line on 0800 048 7520 on Tuesdays (10am–12pm and 2pm–4pm) and Thursdays (10am–12pm and 2pm–6pm) to get information and advice, including on exams and assessments.
4. Your education department can also contact us by email or phone. They can print off course cards from the PET website which give detailed information about assessments and exams for each course: [**www.bit.ly/petcourses**](http://www.bit.ly/petcourses)
5. Once you start your course, you can find information about how it is assessed in the study materials.
6. Contact your course provider if you have any course-related questions, including about arranging exams or assessments. You can ask your education department to email or call them (**find contact details on page 18**).

Sitting exams

If your prison is able to facilitate your exam, please ask your education department to speak to the course provider to make arrangements. A prison staff member can invigilate or supervise the exam at your prison.

Unfortunately, not every prison can facilitate exams. Instead, you might be able to take them on Release on Temporary Licence (ROTL) or after your release. Get in touch with us to find out more.

We can still fund your course even if you can't sit the exam. However, you should seriously consider whether you want to take a course for which you may not be able to gain the qualification.

Applying for funding for exam fees

Most of the courses we offer include the fees for their exams, but some do not. You can check the course descriptions in this prospectus to find out.

If your course does not include the exam fees, you can complete our application form for exam fees, educational books and course extensions (also known as the EEE form). When you are close to completing your course, speak to your education department to make your application.

If you are planning to take your exam in the community, you will need to apply to PET for funding before your release using the EEE form.


Preparing for exams

It's normal to feel nervous before an exam and the best way to stay calm is to do as much revision and preparation as you can. It's essential to complete all the coursework, mock exams and learning activities in the course materials.

Make sure you plan ahead, for example booking time off your job if you have one. The prison staff member invigilating the exam also needs to make sure they are prepared – for example, having a back-up plan in case they are not available on the day.

Your exam will either be “open book” or “closed book”. “Open book” is where you can take your textbooks into the exam. Nevertheless, this requires just as much preparation as a “closed book” exam where no other materials are allowed.

You must take your exam seriously because it can be difficult to re-sit it. You may have to wait months and secure extra funding. Make sure you speak to us or your education department if you have any questions. Good luck!

Keeping in touch with PET

Tell us how you're getting on with your studies and find out what to do if you move or leave prison during your course.

Share your feedback with PET

We will send you a feedback form by post at the start of your studies, and then again towards the end of your course. Please do fill these in – your views really matter and will help us to understand the impact education can have on people in prison and to improve our service.



Moving prison while studying

One of the advantages of studying with PET is that you can take your course with you if you move to another prison.

To ensure that you can continue your studies without interruption, get in touch with PET and your course provider to let us know that you have moved.

It's important that you tell the education department at your new prison that you're studying with PET too.

Studying in the community

If you leave prison while you are still studying, you can continue your course in the community.

Make sure you give your new address to PET, your education department and course provider, so that the provider can continue to send you course materials and give feedback on your assignments.

You might also be able to take your exams in the community while on Release on Temporary Licence (ROTL) or after your release – speak to your course provider to find out how.

Contact details for all PET's course providers are on **pages 108–111**. They should also be included in your course materials.

PET does not fund courses in the community. However, you can call our Advice Line on 0800 048 7520 on Tuesdays (10am–12pm and 2pm–4pm) and Thursdays (10am–12pm and 2pm–6pm) for advice on further study and information about further and higher education institutions that may be able to help.

A guide to making your course application

Once you know which distance learning course you'd like to apply for, here's what to do next:

1

Read this prospectus to make sure we offer the course you'd like to study, or get advice from PET.

2

Speak with your education department to make sure the course you have chosen is right for your needs and circumstances. They will check whether there are any reasons the course might not be suitable.

3

Ask your education department for a PET application form.

4

Fill out the form with your education department's support. Make sure you read the questions carefully and include as much detail as possible in your answers. You can get in touch with PET if you have any questions about how to complete the form. **Find out how to contact us on page 18.**

5

Your education department completes the staff section and sends us the form.

6

PET reviews all applications once a month. Your education department gives you a results letter which lets you know if your application has been successful.

Application successful

- PET orders your course and you receive your study materials from the course provider within three to six weeks.
- You can get advice and guidance from PET throughout your studies, together with help and support from your course provider, education department and peer mentors.

Application unsuccessful

- PET explains why your application has not been successful in your results letter, and suggests the next steps you can take. You can also contact us if you need any advice about what to do.

The application process for Open University Access modules is slightly different. You can find a step-by-step guide for how to apply on page 52.



Courses

Each course description includes:

- The name of the course provider and whether the course is an accredited qualification (meaning it has been approved by a professional organisation)
- The level of study and any entry requirements
- Whether the course includes course provider tutor support
- How long the course might take and how long you have to complete it
- Whether the course has any assignments or exams

GCSEs

GCSE and IGCSE qualifications can help open the door to work and further study.

They are required by many employers and are often essential if you're looking to go to college or university, especially English and Maths GCSEs.

GCSEs and IGCSEs are very similar and are accepted as equivalent qualifications. You can start them at any time of the year, but exams usually take place in June.

Before making your application, please speak to PET or your education department to find out if your prison can hold GCSE or IGCSE exams. Alternatively, you might be able to take the exams on Release on Temporary Licence (ROTL) or after your release – get in touch with us to find out more.

You will need to apply separately for exam fees. Find out how on page 21.

Business IGCSE

Level **2**

Designed for aspiring entrepreneurs and those looking to deepen their understanding of business operations, marketing and finance, this course provides you with a comprehensive introduction to the world of business. The qualification will help you develop sound reasoning and leadership skills and an analytical approach. You'll explore a wide variety of applications and industries and learn how to be innovative and agile in a range of contexts.

Develop your confidence in speaking, listening, reading and writing in English, and gain a vital qualification for your future studies and career. This course covers essential topics such as grammar, vocabulary, textual analysis and creative writing. It will inspire you to think creatively and differently about the complex and intricate language we use every day. This qualification unlocks the power of words and communication, helps you to master the nuances of language, and hones your writing techniques.

You will uncover what literature reveals about society and understand a wide range of literature types, including poetry, prose and drama. You'll study key themes, characters and contexts, fostering a deep appreciation of English literature as you look at the written word in greater depth.

This course will develop key practical skills such as critical thinking, evidence-based research, communication, problem-solving, analytical and independent thinking – essential for a range of careers and further study.

This is a tiered qualification – both Foundation and Higher tiers are included so that you can choose what's best for you.

You will find out how to become a better communicator and discover the skills you need to resolve conflict, handle data, carry out analytical research and be part of a team.

A-levels

Whether you didn't get a chance to take A-levels earlier in life or want to improve on your original results, this is a great opportunity to gain these widely respected qualifications.

We offer A-levels in two parts. For most subjects, when you complete Part 1 you can choose either to take your AS-level exam (a qualification marking the first year of a full A-level) or apply for Part 2 to build up to a full A-level. You will need to apply for each part separately, stating the name of the Part on your application form.

You can start an A-level at any time of the year, but exams usually take place in June. Before making your application, please speak to PET or your education department to find out if your prison can hold A-level exams. Alternatively, you might be able to take the exams on Release on Temporary Licence (ROTL) or after your release – get in touch with us to find out more.



A step-by-step guide to applying for an OU Access module

OU Access modules start in February and October each year. They typically require around nine hours of study per week over 30 weeks.

If you plan to start your studies in February, you can apply from October to January. If you plan to start in October, you can apply from June to September.

- 1 Ask your education department to contact the OU and reserve a place on the module you want to study.
- 2 The OU sends a Registration Agreement form to your education department – you will need to sign this. Your education department returns it to the OU.
- 3 Ask your education department for a PET application form.
- 4 Fill out the form with your education department's support. Make sure you read the questions carefully and include as much detail as possible in your answers. Get in touch with PET if you need any advice on how to complete the form.
- 5 Your education department completes the staff section and sends us the form.

- ❶ PET orders your course and you receive your study materials from the OU about a week before your module start date.
- ❷ You can get advice and guidance from PET throughout your studies, together with help and support from the OU, your education department and peer mentors.
